

Dear Interactive Math Website Owner,

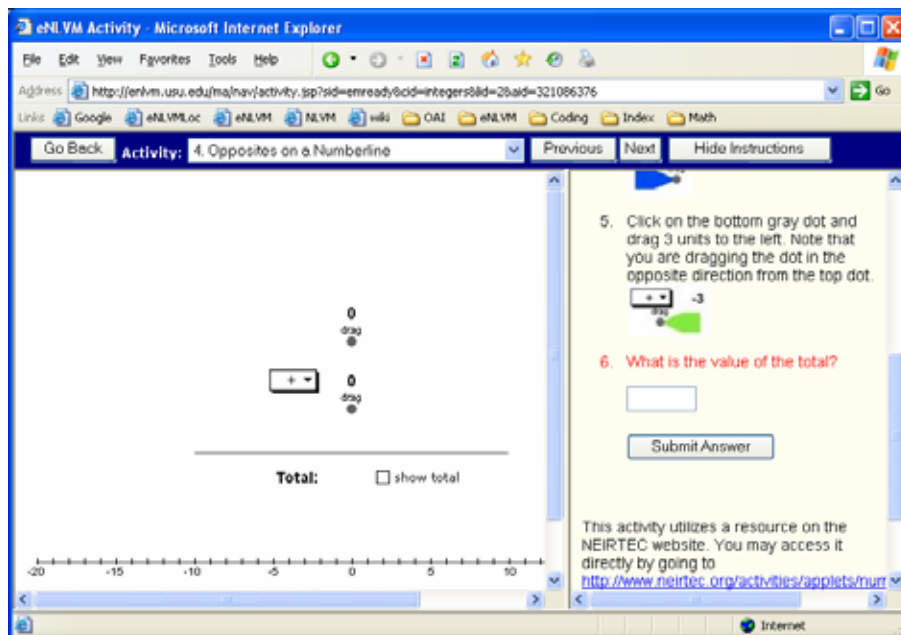
I'm writing to request permission to link to resources on your website. As part of a grant project, we are working with teachers to develop interactive online math lessons. We would like to link from the eNLVM website (<http://enlvm.usu.edu/>) to resources on your website. Allowing us to do so will increase the number of teachers and students that come in contact with your resources. It will also give teachers new options for creating and adapting materials centered around your resources.

The eNLVM is a National Science Foundation funded project to develop interactive online math lessons for 3-12 mathematics. eNLVM resources are and always will be freely available online. In addition to online lessons, the eNLVM provides tools teachers can use to organize online resources for their classes, create contexts for learning, and measure student performance. Lessons in the eNLVM utilize interactive resources from the National Library of Virtual Manipulatives (<http://nlvm.usu.edu/>) and a variety of other websites. Whenever we link to a resource from another website, we credit it with a statement like the following:

Preferably, we would like to link to resources on your website by including them inside browser frames as shown. This helps simplify navigation, maintain context, and establish a tight integration between the text and the resources.

If you are willing to let us link to your resources, but would prefer that we would do so in a manner different than the one we describe, please send us details and we will be happy to accommodate.
